



Position: Spencer Lake Safety/Gear and Logistics/ Overnight support

Location: Spencer Whistle Stop

May 14 - September 19, 2018

Two Full-time positions: 11 days on, 3 off

Responsibilities:

This is a safety position first, maintaining visual and radio coms with kayakers on Spencer Lake and on the Glacier. Previous water rescue and wilderness camping experience is required. The second aspect of this job is preparation of vehicles, kayaks, paddles, skirts, PFDs, gloves, and shell tops and bottoms, etc. This will require overnighting at Spencer Whistle-Stop for 11 days per stint, camping in bear territory in a Yurt or weatherport with Leave No Trace ethic. These two positions are ideal for a couple wanting to live and work in the wilderness together for the summer.

Be prepared to support daily operations for 12-14 hours as directed by guide's manager, owners and guides. Overnight hard ice camp set-up and break down and camp management duties will be expected. Maintain a clean, professional appearance and a happy, positive attitude throughout the season (in potentially terrible weather!) Please see minimum and preferred qualifications below:
